Tables:	Send tables or figures in .rtf, .doc, .gif, .jpg, or tiff format.	
Images:	Images should be sent separately in .jpg format with their file names as the relevant figure #, along with a separate Microsoft Word document that lists the figures and codes them back to the .jpg file. In the submission document write 'Insert Figure #'. Images must have a minimum resolution of 300 PPI.	
Submission Length:	Referred papers:	4000 to 6000 words. See information in Reviewer Report form below

	Practice notes:	500 to 6000 words
	Case studies and biographies:	1000 to 1500 words
